



## What classifications are being considered for the Alameda-Tesla property?

The project team has narrowed the potential classification recommendation down to three options. Both draft concepts could be classified as:

#### **State Park**

**State Natural Reserve\*** 

State Cultural Reserve

Additionally, all three of these classifications could include the Natural Preserve and/or Cultural Preserve subclassifications.

\*If the property is classified as a State Natural Reserve, overnight use would be prohibited.

## Classification Types Not Under Consideration for Alameda-Tesla

State Recreation Area: Unit-wide recreation limited by steep topography and dispersed sensitive resources.

State Vehicular Recreation Area: Prohibited by the PRC.

State Wilderness: Property is < 5,000 acres.

State Historic Park: Historic resources are restricted to relatively small and isolated area.

State Seashore: Property is not coastal.

Marine Managed Area: Property is not coastal.

# Planned Management Actions Regardless of Final Classification

The final selected concept, regardless of whether it is classified as a State Park,
State Natural Reserve, or State Cultural
Reserve, will include management actions that ensure compliance with existing
State Park policies, standards, and best practices related to:

- Sensitive

- Cultural resource management and protection
- Facility
   resilience and
   sustainability
   improvements
- Inter-agency coordination and partnerships

- Visitor

   interpretation
   and education
- Tribal collaboration
- Public safety and hazard mitigation
- Expanding administrative capacity








## How were the Draft Concepts developed?



Document Existing Conditions including sensitive resources, topography, and built features







Gather Community Input on the vision for the property and desired uses during community workshops, a survey, stakeholder meetings, comments, and tribal consultation











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## Develop Management Zones

to create a balanced approach to the protection of sensitive resources and creation of recreational and interpretive opportunities

## Sensitive Resource Zone

Managed to prioritize protection and interpretation of sensitive resources, with limited recreational use.

#### **Limited Access Zone**

Managed for moderate recreational use balanced with interpretive experiences and maintained to protect the natural character, including sensitive resources, of the zone.

## Natural or Cultural Preserve


Managed to ensure highest levels of protection and stewardship of sensitive resources.

#### **Focused Access Zone**

Managed for highquality recreational and interpretive experiences and maintained to protect the natural character, including sensitive resources, of the zone.

#### **Administrative Zone**

Managed for Park operations and administration and maintained to protect the natural character, including sensitive resources, of the zone.



Apply Management Zones to the site by evaluating the mapped sensitive resources, topography, and existing features to determine the location and extent of each management zone






## Draft Concept 1
